2024 KIDS CAMP INFORMATION (For Parents)

SCHEDULE FOR KIDS CAMP WEEKS

- Registration Opens at 3 p.m. Closes at 5 p.m.
- Dinner Served First Day 5:45 p.m.
- Camp Dismissal Noon (lunch will not be served)

CREDIT CARDS - All balances paid with a credit card will be charged a 3.5% fee.

EARLY DISMISSAL – Campers who must leave early, except for emergencies, must make prior arrangements upon registering at camp.

HEALTH & SAFETY – A trained First Aid Administrator & Lifeguards are provided for the safety of the campers. We provide secondary accidental (not illness) insurance, which covers each camper if not covered by other insurance. Emergency hospital facilities are immediately available. All non-prescription and prescription drugs must be in their **labeled original containers** and turned in to the first aid administrator at registration with completed Medication Form. Medications such as Tylenol, ibuprofen, Benadryl, and anti-itch creams do not need to be sent with the camper.

CAMP T-SHIRTS – Camp T-shirts with current camp theme, are available for pre-purchase at \$12 each. Size must be indicated on the registration form. Shirts will be available for pick-up at on-site check-in. Additional shirts can be purchased at camp for \$15 each, subject to availability of size and quantity.

HEAD LICE CHECK - A check for head lice will be performed at all Kids Camps. Our "zero tolerance" policy for all camps means: campers with any signs of nits or lice will not be allowed to check-in and will be sent home. **Please take care of this before coming to camp.** Refunds will NOT be issued.

WHAT TO BRING

- Bible, pen, notebook
- Bedding, pillow, towels, washcloths
- Casual clothes, recreation clothes, gym shoes, sandals, light jacket, umbrella or rain gear, swimsuit, beach cover-up
- Toiletries, and personal products
- Money for offerings
- Spending money for t-shirts, concession stand (\$7-\$10 per day is about average) and camp store items.
- Team color/theme day information will be listed on Facebook Page 1 week before your camp. Indiana Youth Ministries AG (Youth)

WHAT NOT TO BRING

These items will be removed from the camper's possession:

- Electronic devices (games, etc.)
- Comic books, magazines, novels, etc.
- Matches, fireworks, cigarettes, alcoholic beverages, weapons,
- or any illegal substance or item.
- Please do not bring valuables.

Cell Phones are discouraged and will not be allowed during camp activities/services. We are not responsible for lost or stolen items.

VISITING AND PHONE – It is recommended that parents refrain from visiting with, calling, or coming to the camp before the time of dismissal. The above practices usually promote homesickness, disrupt the schedule, and cause other complications.

2024 KIDS CAMP FAQ

What ages should kids be to attend camp?

- O Campers Ages 8-11
- Dish Crew Ages 14-19
- Junior Group Leaders Ages 16-18
- Kids Camp Group Leaders Over 18 years old.

Does camp have a nurse to help administer first aid and pass meds?

 Yes. Each camp is staffed with a Licensed or Registered Nurse who will assist wherever they are needed. Medical Administration Records (MAR) are completed by the parents, brought to camp on the first day, at check-in, and given to the nurse.

How does the camp handle campers' money for spending?

Each child will be given a "bank" card to use, instead of using actual money. This helps when the
child loses their bank card, because their names are on their bank cards. Money can be deposited
into the camper's account at on-site check-in. Any unused money will be refunded back to the
camper at the end of camp.

If I do not pre-pay for a camp T-shirt, can my camper still get one?

Yes. We do order a small number of shirts in assorted sizes that are sold at camp. Quantities are limited, so it is advised that you prepay for your camper's shirt when registering them online.

• When is my camper's balance due?

o Camp balances are due the first day of camp, at on-site check-in.

What should I expect on the first day of camp, at check-in?

- Lice Check will happen first. No campers will be admitted to camp if nits or lice have been found.
 Please pre-check your campers before bringing them to the campgrounds.
- Next will be registration.
 - Leaders only, will enter the check-in area. Kids will stay outside until their leader has gone through the check-in stations. Leaders should be prepared to pay your camper's balance. This is when leaders will receive rooming assignments and any pre-paid t-shirts.
- The bank is where campers will go next. Each camper should give their leaders an envelope with their Full Name, Church City/Name, and Amount included marked on the outside (one for each camper). The bank will allow deposits only. Campers will be able to get their spending cards later that evening during concession time.
- Finally, all medications will go to the nurse, along with a completed MAR (mentioned above).

When will my camper meet their Group Leader?

• Campers will meet their Group Leader shortly after they move into their dorms. This is also when campers will receive their team wristbands.

Can I send mail to my camper while they are at camp?

 Yes, but make sure you send it well in advance if you are mailing it. It is recommended that you bring your letters with you and deposit them in the camp mailbox at check-in.

Does Indiana NextGen offer scholarships for campers?

No, we do not. We always suggest that the local church offer scholarships for campers.

Does Lake Placid offer dietary substitutions for campers with allergies?

 Our Lake Placid camp kitchen is not a scratch kitchen, but a devoted refrigerator is available for GF foods. You must provide your own substitutions, but Lake Placid does offer alternative, safe foods such as a salad bar, fruits, and veggies.
